Guide for Properly Calculating Evaluation Scores

This guide is for coordinators to assist them in the calculation of the Select Team player evaluation scores. It is assumed that Coordinators and Evaluators have followed the “*Coach and Player Selection Guidelines*” and other written procedures such as the “*Select Team Field Player Evaluations*” and the “*Select Team Goalkeeper Evaluations*” documents.

As the coordinator, you will collect all the score sheets from the evaluators at the end of the evaluation (or at the end of each evaluation day if it spans multiple days). From these sheets the coordinator needs to calculate the following **for each evaluation day that the player attended**:

- 6 v 6 Average Score
- 3 v 3 Average Score
- Evaluation Day Average Score

If the evaluation spans multiple days, and players attend both days, the Evaluation Day Average Score for each day will be **averaged** together to produce a players Final Evaluation Score. If a player only attends one evaluation day, the players Evaluation Day Average Score will be their Final Evaluation Score.

When coming up with the 6 v 6 and 3 v 3 Average Scores most players will be seen by the same number of evaluators (i.e. all those that are present). However, the following situations may occur that could cause a player to have a different number of evaluators:

- A player who arrived late or had to leave the evaluation early.
- An evaluator who arrived late or had to leave the evaluation early.
- Players that need a break because of illness or injury.
- Issues with the process that caused some evaluators not to see certain players.
- Parents who served as evaluators who should not score their own children.

When tabulating the scores, the coordinator will have to translate from the players pennie color/number to the players name based on a particular evaluation days master sheet. This can be a confusing task. It is suggested that the coordinator keep all materials from a particular evaluation day together and never work with information from multiple days at the same time to avoid confusion. Ask evaluators to put their name and evaluation date on all score sheets at the beginning of the evaluation day.

The following sheets illustrate **an example** of how to calculate the scores. You can use the same format or combine the data onto fewer sheets provided you follow the same mathematical calculations. Blank sheets are also provided. Software such as Microsoft Excel or Lotus 123 can be used as long as the same calculations are used.

Save your results. The evaluation committee may find them helpful in determining future procedures (wouldn't need player names & pinnie numbers).
